Minutes: Jim read the November 16, 2021 minutes. Motion by Christine Goodness and seconded by Pat Klein to accept the minutes as read. Motion carried.

Extension Office: The extension is asking for us to update the mailing list. They need a current list for the mailings.

Booklets: Booklets were printed. Non-Club 51 members had their books mailed to them. Club 51 members will get their booklets at the meeting. The booklets have changed due to COVID and changed in the Extension Office. Please read the entire booklet to understand the program changes. We will be having programs during the summer months because we need to book for the year to get the room free. Linda O'Donnell sent Ken Hartje a thank you letter for the Fire Safety presentation that he did at the Club 51 meeting.

Treasurer's Report: Connie handed out a spreadsheet for the end of year report for 2021 and the budget for 2022. Reviewed the spreadsheet. Discussed a fundraiser to increase our income because our expenses were greater than our income. Quilt raffle was one idea that was brought up. The quilt raffle would for Scholarships and Bookworms. Find a way to reduce the cost of meals at events. Some changes were made to the 2022 budget. Connie will make the changes. Motion was made to have two \$500 scholarships this year, one for 2021 and one for 2022, by Connie Eisch and seconded by Christine Goodness. Motion carried.

Event Guidelines: Judy suggested that we have some guidelines for events.

By-Laws: The by-laws that were drafted in 2016, were read and changes were made after discussing each item. The new by-laws will be published in the April Connection to be reviewed by the members. The vote on the new by-laws will happen at County Day on May 10, 2022.

West District Fall Meeting: The meeting will be held at The First Congregational Church UCC at 311 2nd Street South, Wisconsin Rapids. There is going to be a charge to have it there, but we do not know how much at this time. Diane will check with Connie Eisch to see what we have paid on the past. A discussion followed on what to serve for the breakfast and the lunch. Diane will check with Piggly Wiggly in Nekoosa IGA in Wisconsin Rapids and Laurie for a cost. The menu will consist of fruit tray and coffee cake for breakfast. Lunch menu will be barbecued pulled pork, cheesy potatoes, coleslaw, and brownies. Refreshments at both meals will be coffee, tea and juice. The theme is "The Changing Colors of HCE". Name tags will be leaves made by Peggy Wettstein. 
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Three Exercises for Shoulder Mobility

Carl's Corner



All these exercises are meant to keep the shoulders moving well in order to reach high shelves, scratch your back, and give high fives.





- 1. **Stick shoulder flexion: 2 x 15 reps** Pick up a broomstick, cane, or anything similar and raise the arms up as high as possible. (Bobs is unsure how to do this one without hands...)
- 2. **Behind the back towel stretch 2 x 30s** Use a towel hung over a shoulder to pull the other arm up along the back. (Yes Bobs, a tie would work too!)





3. **Posterior shoulder stretch:** 3 x 30s - Use one arm to pull the other across your chest. (Keeps the arm mobile for construction work!)




