

All these exercises are meant to keep up good foot clearance to avoid tripping and more importantly, avoid stepping on a Lego.


 Lying flat on your back for 5 minutes - Easiest exercise ever. Just lie down on your back. Flat on the floor is ideal.

If you can always lie flat, you can always stand up straight! And look taller for your upcoming date.



2. **Shoulder Squeeze 2 x 15 reps** - Squeeze the shoulder blades together.

Sculpt the back for your nice dress during the date.



3. Cervical extension 2 x 15 reps - Looking slowly up to the ceiling.

Need to be able to look up if your date is tall, dark and handsome.

4. Back rotation 2×15 reps - Cross your arms and rotate side to side

Keep the back nice and mobile for in-date dancing.
