The books are chosen through the partnership of Wisconsin Association for Home and Community Education (WAHCE) and the University of Wisconsin Division of Extension Family Living Program. There are seven books in the set which are provided to each child.

Funding for the books is provided by you! There have been generous donations from our members, community individuals, and memorials to fund the cost of the books for each student. Also, we have had wonderful, generous grants provided by Greater Kenosha Community Foundation, St. Mary's Church, the Paddock Lake Lions Club, and other community organizations throughout this year. Thanks to Donna Z. for being our grant writer on behalf of KCAHCE and our students!

Readers spend about 30 minutes per month in the classroom with the students reading and reviewing the book provided and doing a short activity. You may use the activity sheet provided as a guide for ideas for the activity.

We have the books and would like to expand to more schools; therefore, we need more readers. The makeup of classrooms has changed due to Covid.
