



March Education Program "Tiny Hooves Sanctuary"



Twenty-three KCAHCE members and guests turned out for our March educational program at the Kenosha County Center! Guest speaker, Sandi Swiss, VP of Tiny Hooves Sanctuary, shared a video and PowerPoint about the 33 acre Union Grove Sanctuary; that provides a forever home to 23 species and over100 resident farmed animals; many of whom have had ugly pasts.

Among other things, we learned:

- how the sanctuary began
- what they've done to date

- where they are going
- what we can do to help

Focusing on individual care, each resident is helped socially, emotionally, and physically -- each has a name and their own story. The Rescue aims to educate about on-farm animal care, the animal's individuality, facts of the animal ag industry and veganism. And are changing hearts through their efforts.

Many thanks to the Good Neighbors Club for organizing a collection of blankets and towels for the Sanctuary, and to all who donated.
