Boxes of Love

A new service project is underway for CCAHCE. "Boxes of Love" are a supportive aift of comfort to families of suicide victims. Columbia County suffers about 12-15 suicides each year, with three happening in the last month. The Columbia County Medical Examiner is in close contact with the families of victims and provides the "Boxes of Love" to these families. Fach box contains booklets on topics like arief and coping skills, and contains a small comfort item.

That's where HCE members come in. We will create small (about 4-5 inches) heart-shaped pillows to include in the boxes. They can be stitched of scrap fabric, and buttons or other favorite trims can be added. The edges can be cut with a pinking shears, then simply stitch and stuff them well, so they are very "comfy" when hugged. A template is included with this newsletter.

When you have completed a number of heart pillows, bring them to a meeting, or contact Liz Miller (608-742-4604, <u>Izmiller@palacenet.net</u>) who will

arrange to get them and deliver them to the Medical Examiner's office.
