

We were greeted with welcoming smiles, enjoyed area tours, seminars, food, entertainment, rekindled friendships, received some Award accolades for our County, and enjoyed the shared camaraderie of other like-minded women. What a surprise Matthias Academy was – we never expected to see all the things they do at Matthais for adults over the age of 18 who are mentally or physically challenged.

The September education program was attended by 16 KCAHCE members. We toured the fantastic facility, talked with staff and met some of the students.

We were amazed at everything they do for their students.

Located in Benet Lake just southwest of Bristol, with a staff of about 65 they currently serve over 125 adults from Illinois and Wisconsin. There are two off-site residential houses with four adults and two staff. Plans are in the works for an expanded site along Highway 83 in Salem.





INTERNATIONAL NEWS from WAHCE

Jerin Moore, our county and district International Chair attended the International workshop at the WAHCE Annual Business Meeting and Conference. Here is some of the news about international endeavors:

ACWW USA AREA PROJECT:

Is enlisting our cooperation involving the theme of FOOD INSECURITY for the next 3 years; with year one's focus on Food Deserts.

WHAT IS A FOOD DESERT?

They are geographic areas where residents have few to no convenient options for securing affordable and healthy foods, especially fresh fruits & veggies. Food Deserts are disproportionately found in high poverty areas and create extra everyday hurdles that can make it harder for kids, families and communities to grow healthy.

WHAT CAN WE DO?

- * Establish bus stop farmers' markets
- Support community gardens
- Improve public transportation options

ORANGE THE WORLD

The Orange the World symbol is an umbrella, symbolizing protection or shelter. It is UNESCO's symbol for NO to Violence against Women". WAHCE Seminar participants received an Orange the World button.



ACWW is also encouraging us to learn about the UNESCO (United Nations Educational Scientific, and Cultural Organization) campaign, "Orange the World". And asks that we become more aware of violence in our homes, schools, communities. NOVEMBER 25th is the International Day of Elimination of Violence against women and children and is designated "Orange Day"; as the color Orange symbolizes a brighter future free of violence, and a way to demonstrate solidarity in violence elimination.

WHAT CAN WE DO?

- Learn more in our community
- * Support agencies like homeless and Domestic Violence Shelters.
- * Have a "wear orange" meeting.

WISCONSIN NICARAGUA PARTNERS



WI/NP goal is "People Helping People" as we work to help them to expand their knowledge, gain skills, and help families grow.

- Take a box ~ fill a box is a project we've been participating in to some extent with our Shoebox Collection ~ filled with items like beauty, sewing, cooking/baking, crafts/knitting, jewelry making etc to help women learn skills.
- WI/NP has started to widen their outreach to include countries of Ghana, Honduras, Ukraine and Turkey because recent new regulations in Nicaragua are causing restraints and adding to shipment concerns. WI/NP has broadened their outreach and slogan, accordingly to: "HELPING PEOPLE AROUND THE WORLD".

A name change for 'Learning Centers' is in the works, as this name it implies a kind of formality of training; vs a more learn by doing club kind of process.
