WISCONSIN BOOKWORMS



Walworth County received a certificate for reading to children for 25 years through the Wisconsin Bookworm program at the 2023 Wisconsin State HCE Conference in Wisconsin Dells last September. Currently, five women are reading to 180 Head Start students in Rock and Walworth counties at four different sites. WAHCE purchased sets of seven books. Students get a copy of the

book read to their class each month the reader visits. A copy of the book is also left for the classroom.

At the January 30, 2024 WAHCE county board meeting, it was determined that enough funds remain in the HCE treasury to purchase books for the 2024-25 school year. While the Wisconsin State Bookworm Director has the final choice of what books are ordered, a team from across the state reviews the books that the state Director feels will fit in the established criteria: numbers, animals, MixMash (Me | Self-Esteem | Kindness | Diversity | Seasonal), bilingual; availability (3,800 in stock at Scholastic) and together equal a reasonable price.

SEWING – LOOKING BACK

There was a sewing meeting held recently on Tuesday, February 13 at 9:00 a.m. The meeting was held at Millard Church on County Road O, Millard. We have been sewing here for quite some time. Many years ago, Barb Papcke and I attended a program at State Conference and thought we could do this as a county project. We thought we could make little quilts or blankets; we used fabric that was cut 36" long 45" wide. We bought some fabric and filler and thought we were set for our first meeting. We needed a place with many outlets and space to work. Barb and I decided to ask Millard church if we could have our work meetings there and we have been working there ever since. We are members of Millard church.

Our first sewing meeting was on February 6, 2001. Nineteen women attended that meeting. They came not knowing just exactly what we had in mind; some brought their sewing machines and scissors. Some of the ladies sewed that day and others took the quilts home to sew and brought them back the following meeting. Our goal was to make little quilts and provide them to the community. We delivered quilts to area Fire Departments for the rescue squads, to Police Departments for Deputies to have in their trunk if needed for one reason or another. We also made adult quilts and took them to area nursing homes.

Our hat project also came from State Conference. Our funding started from a donation given to HCE at the Walworth County Fair where there was a hat on display, indicating we wanted to start that project but needed funding. Since then, we have made many hats. During one of our sewing meetings a member asked why we weren't making comfort pillows. We had no idea what she was talking about, and she explained that her daughter had breast cancer and used one of those little pillows. I was given the pattern and had some pillows cut out ready for the next meeting and we have been making them ever since.

We have made walker caddies and delivered them to a few facilities in the area and have also sold a few of them. We were asked by a hospital to make drain pouches, which are used to hold the drains that are used after breast surgery.

We also made many book bags over the years for children who received our Bookworm books. Below are some of the things HCE has been busy making over the past 23 years. I was asked to report on how many ideas we have constructed.

From February 14. 2017 through August 8, 2023:

- Comfort Pillows 3,996
- Hats **2,033**
- Drain Pouches 1,463

- Quilts **825**
- This is a total of **7,917** items made and delivered in the past 6 years.

Ok, that tells you what we did from February 2017 to August 2023 and how many articles we have made and donated. You may ask what happened to those 7,917 articles? Here are the places we have donated our wares:

- Aurora Vince Lombardi Cancer Center now Southern Lakes Medical Burlington
- Memorial Hospital of Burlington
- Aurora Kenosha Hospital
- Waukesha Memorial Hospital
- Pro Health Hospital Mukwonago hats, comfort pillows, drain pouches, which were also sent to Waukesha and Pewaukee hospitals
- Willowfield Nursing Home & Rehab, now known as Delavan Health Center small quilts and walker caddies
- Vintage on the Ponds small quilts and walker caddies
- Lakeland Nursing Home small quilts and walker caddies
- Walworth County Sheriff's Department & Rescue Squads small quilts
- Delavan Rescue Squad small quilts
- LaGrange Rescue Squads small quilts
- Head Start book bags

As all things, time is changing HCE. Some of our 19 sewers have moved, some of the ladies are having trouble with their eyes and don't sew anymore, and some of our members have passed on. We are now between 5 and 10 sewers at most. We no longer can produce the many items we once did, but we continue to sew to help others who are going through a tough time in their life.

Thank you to all those who have helped with our project in any way.
