Dear HCE Members.

We hardly had enough winter to finish all the indoor projects I had planned—like more quilting and knitting—and here we are, speeding into the busyness of spring! I am a very seasonal hobby-ist. As soon as the weather is nice, I want to be outdoors. Even though I plan to cut back on the size and style of my vegetable garden this year, there are still plenty of perennial flowerbeds, berry bushes and fruit trees that need attention. I purchased a new toy recently: a batteryoperated mini-chainsaw. And that is really helping me with the bigger pruning tasks.

Have you heard of hügelkultur? It's a German word that means "hill culture." In gardening, it is a mound garden that starts with a layer of dead logs and branches, covered by other organic materials, and topped off with a layer of soil. The wood decays, returning nutrients to the soil for a waste-free garden. Another advantage is that they help conserve water, so many areas of the country that are drought-prone are using these gardens. Gardeners using tall, raised beds are using this method to avoid purchasing soil to fill the entire structure. My back is really tired of

getting down to ground level to garden, so I am going to use old cattle watering tanks as raised beds, and will fill the bottoms first with the dead wood that I have been pruning. It's been a fun project to plan out this winter, and now it's time to get going on it. I'm excited to try something new!

The criteria for scholarship applicants has changed for 2025.

Currently a high school senior is eligible to apply if he/she is a relative of a Columbia County Home and Community Education member. A student is also eligible to apply if he/she will major in family living education, culinary arts, horticulture, agriculture, interior design, or fashion design. These majors have been broadened to include any family living, education, or health-related field.
