

Kenosha County Association for Home and Community Education



The following is a brief description of Committees.

Association Assistant: Perform clerical support for organization including making copies, typing, email announcements and preparation of the annual Membership Directory and Handbook.

Budget Committee: Treasurer is Chair. One meeting is usually required to prepare the annual budgets for the General Operating Account and the Scholarship Account. Make recommendations for scholarships and contributions based upon available funds.

Community Service Project: Conduct community service project(s) appropriate to the needs of the Kenosha community including selection of project, solicitation of funds and/or needed items (i.e., diapers and items for Veterans in 2021), delivery of products and/or funds to site.

Cultural Arts Event: Organize and set up the Cultural Arts Show at an event in the spring of 2025 using WAHCE Entry form. Solicit entries from members, arrange for show, obtain non-HCE judges, conduct show, and submit entries to WAHCE show at the annual conference.

Extension Line: Contact officers, committee chairpersons and clubs to secure specific and timely articles, compose newsletter, assist with copying, preparing, and distribution of newsletters.

Fall Focus: Arrange for location, food, decorations, entertainment, preparation of flyer, program for event, set price and host event. It is held in late September or October. A short Association Meeting is held at this event.

Families Branching Out: Secure exhibitors with a focus on educational and fun activities for families, arrange publicity, prepare flyers, set up and take down venue. It is held at the Kenosha County Center the last Saturday in April

Financial Review: To review the financial records and the annual financial statements for KCAHCE and verify accuracy of accounts. One meeting is usually required to complete the review.

International: Promote the WAHCE and other international projects.

Marketing/Public Relations: Market KCAHCE, for example, set up displays in city of Kenosha and County of Kenosha libraries and other businesses. Also, send news releases to media, update the Kenosha HCE brochure, print, and keep in stock in public places.

Membership: Promote HCE to attract members. Create an "elevator" speech to sum up what we are all about. Develop materials for new members. At Fall Focus Event, recognize members for years of membership. Possibly create Extension Line articles or print media explaining what we are about.

Milaeger's Money/Flower Power: This is our fundraiser for scholarships. Help sell and distribute certificates, including collection of money. Kick-off is at the March education program.

Nominating: Contact members and seek their willingness to serve as an officer. Present a slate of candidates for election at fall association meeting. If more than one person is running for an office, prepare a ballot.

Program Planning: Vice President is Chair of committee. Plan the educational programs for organization. 2025 Committee will plan programs for 2026. Obtain speakers, set location and host events, prepare any needed copies, etc.,

Scholarship: Review and prepare scholarship forms, solicit applications, determine amount of funds available and number of scholarships to award, select recipients, notify, and host them at spring event. Usually, one or two meetings.

2025 Spring Event: Make all necessary arrangements for a social or educational event including location, food, cost, decorations, advertisement, and then hosting the event.

Wisconsin Bookworms: Read to children at Westosha Head Start, Brass School and/or Cesar Chavez Center in Kenosha including doing the activity on the sheets provided. Committee members also may assist in preparing books for reading and fundraising. Training for readers will be provided.






Kenosha Women's Network Grants

Kenosha Women's Network is a group of local women entrepreneurs, business professionals, elected officials, and non-profit organizations. Jeri and I heard about the group last winter and, after attending a couple of meetings, decided to join and partake in the great networking.

Kenosha Women's Network meets the second Friday of every month at Casa Capri – we enjoy a lunch, network, and hear a speaker. All meetings start at noon and are done by 1:15. It has been a great resource to make valuable contacts for HCE.

KWN has fundraising activities to earn funds to provide grants to local and non-profit organizations. They award about \$11,000 every year – based on the success of the fundraising activities. In August, I applied for a grant for Wisconsin Bookworms and Families Branching Out.

I am happy to report that in September, \$12,742.70 was awarded to 13 groups for 14 different programs. We received two grants – one for Wisconsin Bookworms and the other for Families Branching Out! This

extra funding has allowed us to purchase additional books and bookbags for the Head Start children and good "seed" money for Families Branching Out.



Thank you Dr. Annie for taking us down your path and sharing your cultural stories!


Hmong Culture in Wisconsin



Heidi Nevoso, Chair of the committee, has now distributed the books to the readers. The current HCE readers are Mary Flanagan, Marcia Richards, and Cheryl Widen. There are

also three non-HCE members who are reading. Heidi is contacting one more persons to read as our program has now expanded into 13 classrooms. We will be reading to over 220 children!

An increase of 40 over last year. It seems students are once again returning to Head Start after COVID.

We also have a unique classroom of all Spanish students, so Heidi has contacted the WAHCE Wisconsin Bookworms State Chairman to obtain more books in Spanish!! What a great opportunity.
