

BOOKWORMS

I want to thank one of our members, Lola Kleinsmith from the Happy Hollanders Club, for personally supporting our commitment to Head Start and providing books for the youngest children who attend.

As you know we have the Bookworms program for the children ages 3-4. Sheryl Smith writes grants to buy a set of books for each child and 9 volunteers go to the classrooms each month from October through March to read to the children.

A few months ago, Lola contacted County President Sheryl Smith to tell her about a grant program supported by Thrivent Financial where she is a member. As a member, she can apply for a \$250 Visa Debit Card to be used for charitable purposes. She asked if there was anything we could use it for. Sheryl contacted Marsha Amundson at Head
