Our Local Community Outreach Projects...

Washington County HCE Mitten Tree Project

For more than 20 years, WCAHCE has been collecting homemade and store-bought mittens, hats, scarves and other items to keep members of our community warm during Wisconsin winters. Thousands of these items have been collected and donated over the years. Teachers tell us that it is difficult to send children outside to exercise in the winter when they don’t have the proper winter clothing, which was the catalyst for this project All items collected are donated within the county to schools and not for profit organizations such as food pantries.



Wisconsin Bookworms™ a WAHCE sponsored program with educational support from UW Madison-Division of Extension. It is designed to provide free books and an early reading experience to children from limited income families. Each month during the school year, volunteers read a book to the children, engage them in a related activity, and give a copy of the book to each child to take home to help create their own in-home library. Educational activity sheets are also provided for each book. Washington County Association for Home & Community Education supports the programs by raising funds to purchase the books. We have successful partnerships with Head Start and 6 Child Care Centers.



Karl’s Place is a Washington Co. shelter that serves single men & women at risk of homelessness. The shelter addresses a gap in services in our community, bringing together shelter, meals, basic health services, and quality case management for individuals at risk of homelessness. In support of the community, HCE gives graduate baskets to individuals for their new homes. We fill the laundry baskets with cleaning supplies, paper products, personal products, and cooking supplies. Club members give in-kind and monetary donations. After the baskets are put together, we add an HCE card to congratulate them on their new home. In the card, we include a HCE brochure, and a \$10 gift card to a local store. The basket is delivered to the shelter on a regular basis, the managers love receiving these baskets and the clients think it’s a wonderful gift.

Our History-Homemakers to HCE
From 1937 until 1993 Washington County had community **Homemaker clubs**.

In 1993, the organization followed the lead of the national association and became the Wisconsin Association for Family and Community Education. The following year the state association voted to withdraw from the national association and chose the name, **Wisconsin Association for Home & Community Education, Inc.-Also known as HCE**.
