## Green Bay Packers Foundation Awards Grants

The Green Bay Packers Foundation announced in October it has distributed \$1.5 million in annual grants to 398 civic and charitable groups throughout the state of Wisconsin in its annual distribution of grants. Wilson Jones, chairperson of the Foundation, made the announcement, honoring and recognizing the outstanding efforts and services performed by each of the organizations.

Of the Foundation's contributions, 54 grants – aggregating \$210,550 – were awarded to Brown County organizations. Additional grants, totaling \$1,289,450, were made to 344 other groups around the state. "We're proud to award \$1.5 million through our annual Packers Foundation grants this year," said Packers President/CEO Mark Murphy. "We are incredibly grateful for the work the recipient organizations carry out each and every day. The Packers are honored to recognize and support their dedication to positively impacting their communities."

This year's grant cycle focused on organizations that will direct the funds toward the need areas of arts and culture, athletics and education. Grants were awarded to organizations located in 55 of Wisconsin's 72 counties, with 143 grants going to arts and culture, 66 to athletics and 189 to education. Grants ranged from \$3,000 to \$8,000.

The Kenosha HCE was fortunate to receive a grant for their Wisconsin Bookworms Program. Kenosha HCE purchases a set of books (five to seven books per set) for children in Head Start. Readers go to the Brass School, Chavez Center and Westosha Head Start, read a book monthly to the children, and then give each child a book bag to keep their books in and a book. The books in the set are in English and Spanish. The funding will be used to purchase books, activity sheets, labels and book bags. Members thank the Green Bay Packers Foundation for their generous donation.

## Wisconsin Bookworms

The Kenosha Wisconsin Bookworms project is pleased to report that the 24-25 school year has an increase of student participants to 234! We are finally reading to the number of students prior to Covid. Over the past few years with the decreased number of students, the changes to all-day classrooms versus two sections of half-day classrooms, and the recent addition of a full Spanish class, we needed to be flexible with our annual order in June. Having had some extra books, we were able to provide some books and read during the Family Branches out event.



We are grateful for several memorial gifts and being awarded generous gift grants from the Kenosha Community Foundation, the Lions Foundation of Kenosha, Kenosha Women's Network and the Green Bay Packers Foundation. It is wonderful our community finds value and partnership in our reading program. Thank you to Donna Zarovy for her efforts of preparing the grant submissions, interviewing and communicating on behalf of the project.

Currently we have 8 readers in 13 classrooms reading and engaging with the 234 students at Chavez Learning Center and Brass Community School in Kenosha and Holy Cross Head Start in Wilmot. By the school year end, each student receives a set of seven books along with a Wisconsin Bookworms tote bag.
